To the Most Devoted Servants of the Lord, Brothers Theophile and Koste

Precious, inestimable brothers and friends:

There is no reasons why a brother who is in tangible misery would not before asking for money, expose his material needs to Our Supreme Provider, who never forsakes a devoted and wellintentioned child. Those who surreptitiously annoy their brothers with constant tedious petitions of money have certainly not their souls in peace with God; because if they had they would not be afraid to ask help from Him, whose wisdom knows if it is necessary or extravagance. So I beg of you, from the Lord's demand to secure yourselves against all attempts of this sort. The Supreme Master would be extremely afflicted if through some one's dishonesty you would lose some valuables or money of your own. I then, remind you the Master's word: Do not loan money to any One. Please, for your own good or at least without informing yourselves to whom you have affair with.

My dear brother Theophile:

The Lord and I know your indomitable ardor for the progress, the improvement and the increasing of the Mission, and your valuable deeds are registered and impregnated in the Heart of the Utmost; but I personally demand of you a favor. Even if you acknowledge errors or even big faults among the brethren, I pray you to be very indulgent and tolerant for them. Use the kindness and the sweetness of the Lamb who forgives all sorts of iniquities when there is repentance. I understand the repulsiveness that you inwardly fell for the dissolution that you witness among certain members, but I beseech you, in spite of your stoical righteousness to take the sweet means, the tender method of the Lamb to correct your wandering sheep. I understand that you do not want to tolerate evil of any kind, and you must be congratulated for it; all hypocrisy and lewdness must be banished from our ranks; but you know human nature being so weak, so feeble, so degenerated that

you cannot regenerate it in a single stroke, so I beg of you to employ the soft, the tender ways to reprehending it. On the other hand if there is obvious reluctance and stubbornness on the part of the coreligionnary, you cannot permit the contamination of the flock by allowing the cancer to be widespread all over the Mission. What the Lord & Master-God told you through me, I still maintain it, and never shall I contradict His divine Intents, but I simply ask you a kind tolerance for the sinners. Because if we will banish all the evildoers, there would not be a single soul in the Mission to-day, so inconsistent is the human biped. You are certainly right in wanting to purge, to clean the Mission of all the poisonous and corrupted wiles and influence of women, the dangerous destructors of good, you are doubly right, hundred times right; all good servants of the Almighty should be like you on that purpose. Why should there exist so many wives and sisters or mistresses even, be the leader of some of the men's actions?? Cannot the Husband or the man in general be intelligent enough to conduct his own acts without being influenced or guided by a female inspiration? This is one of the greatest weakness of man's faults to let women lead his own affairs; and unavoidably that leads him to his fall and his irremediable ruin. Happy is the man that has sense enough to understand this great truth and puts it into practice! So be blessed, you, who have this inestimable quality, and let the world think what he wished, but none before you till now has accomplished what you have accomplished.

I repeat to your worthy partner Koste in the fulfilment of God's intents the unmeasurable contentment and satisfaction of the Divine Master which He feels in your colossal Work... Do not believe for a single minute that I want to flatter or panegyrize you; no, I simply want to attribute to you what you eminently deserve. You are the precious stones which adorn the beautiful Jerusalem and your merit shine above all. You are only infants to speak allegorically, in the comprehension of God's Will, and yet you have accomplished marvels of which the Lord-Master rejoices. Oh, yes, be blessed! And be respected by all, because you are the elected and the cup-bearers of God's best wine! I would say more; You are the delight of the Master at present. Your work is phenomenal and deserves a reciprocal reward.
